Dear Susan

Please excuse my long delay in replying to your letter but as announced in the company newsletter I have been away for the past 6 weeks.

The cause of kennel cough is well known, being either a virus, bacteria or a mixture of both. Vaccines are also available to prevent this disease. The usual veterinary treatments include antibiotics, anti-inflammatory management and cough mixtures.

All cases need to be examined by a veterinary surgeon because some develop secondary problems like pneumonia which can be life threatening.

Our products can be used to complement those prescribed by the veterinary surgeon. I tend to give 60mls Aloe Vera gel per day, 1 propolis tablet twice daily, 1 garlic and thyme twice daily. If there is a lot of nasal congestion I let them inhale nebulised Aloe veterinary formula. The veterinary formula can also be used diluted to bathe out their eyes if there is an associated conjunctivitis.

I have found the above regime beneficial in cases of kennel cough when used in combination with the normal veterinary treatments.

I hope you find the above beneficial.
